# Spark hazards are everywhere!

Even the tiniest spark can ignite leaking gas.

## When gas is leaking, make sure NO ONE at the scene:

- Rings doorbells.
- Uses garage door openers.
- Uses a TV remote or any other type of remote controller.
- Operates light switches.
- Turns on or off any appliance or other electrical device.
- Uses telephones, cell phones or pagers.
- Uses a flashlight (unless it is intrinsically safe).
- Lights a match, uses a lighter or smokes cigarettes, e-cigarettes or vape pens.
- Steps on doormats or shuffles across carpet. Friction from boots could create a spark of static electricity.
- Uses any form of electronic ignition.

**Smell Gas. Act Fast.

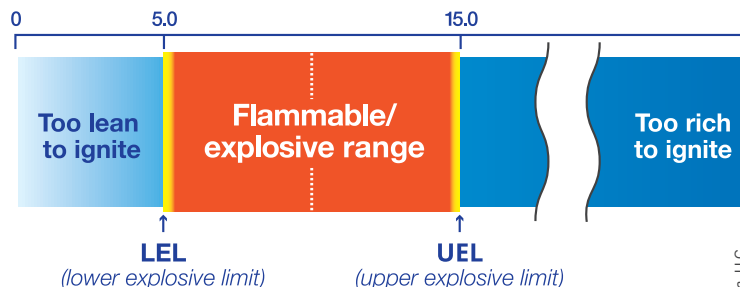
