- Rings doorbells.
- Uses garage door openers.
- Uses a TV remote or any other type of remote controller.
- Operates light switches.
- Turns on or off any appliance or other electrical device.
- Uses telephones, cell phones or pagers.
  - Uses a flashlight (unless it is intrinsically safe).
    - Lights a match, uses a lighter or smokes
      - cigarettes, e-cigarettes or vape pens.
      - could create a spark of static electricity.
    - Uses any form of electronic ignition.

#### Smell Gas. Act Fast. Be the one to call 911.
