Use 811 before you dig. It's the law.

Dial 811 or make an online request at your state 811 center's website.

This FREE service marks buried gas lines and utilities so you can dig safely. Wait the required time for your state before starting. Always call 811 before any digging, even for small or shallow projects. Do not dig until lines have been marked or you're notified the area is clear of utilities.

► **For Massachusetts:**

- Dial **811** or **1-888-DIG-SAFE (344-7233)** or request a Dig Safe ticket at digsafe.com.
- Wait at least **72 hours** excluding weekends and legal holidays.

► **For Upstate New York:**

- Dial **811** or **1-800-962-7962** or use the ticket-entry system at UDigNY.org.
- Wait at least **two full working days**, excluding the date that you notify 811, weekends and legal holidays.

► **For New York City and Long Island:**

- Dial **811** or **1-800-272-4480** or use the ticket-entry system at newyork-811.com.
- Wait at least **two full working days**, excluding the date that you notify 811, weekends and legal holidays.
